**Main Regulations of the European Youth Basketball League for the Season
2023/2024
EYBL U17 and U20**

1. Financial rules

- 1.1. Participation fee for one season is 1200EUR. Stage organizing teams do not pay a participation fee. Participation fee must be paid together with the application for the season. Applications are being accepted until September 1st 2023.
- 1.2. Every player pays a licence fee 15EUR per player for a full season. Licence fees must be paid until October 1st 2023 or with new applications added during the season.
- 1.3. Stage organizer has to cover gym, referee, scorekeeper, water, livestream and prize expenses while hosting their stage.
- 1.4. Visiting teams cover their travel, food and hotel expenses.
- 1.5. Stage organizer provides hotel and dining for the price of 50EUR per day per person. Visiting team can decline this option 30 days before the stage, by informing stage organizers and EYBL. In that case the visiting team is responsible for their own dining and hotel reservations.

2. Competition system

- 2.1. Competition is played by standard FIBA rules.
- 2.2. EYBL regular season is played in North and South divisions.
- 2.3. EYBL regular season has two regular season stages. Teams are divided into 9 team groups, where each team plays one game against each team within two stages. Teams play 4 games each stage.
- 2.4. At the end of the season Superfinal and Challenge Cup is played.
- 2.5. Twelve best teams, six from each division, play in the Superfinal phase.
- 2.6. Teams ranked eighth to twelfth (that did not make it to Superfinal) play in the Challenge Cup.
- 2.7. Season is played by a previously set schedule by the EYBL office and is held from September to May.

3. Other rules

- 3.1. EYBL office is run in Riga and Budapest. The EYBL North president is Arturs Senhofs and the EYBL South president is Balazs Radics.

- 3.2. EYBL keeps copyrights to all video, foto and data created within EYBL competition.
- 3.3. EYBL keeps the right to unilaterally remove teams from competition for breaking any rule in paragraph 1 within these regulations.
- 3.4. In case of Force Major situations, EYBL reserves the right to cancel or alter the progression of the season.
